Document Summary	This policy details how we store, process and handle personal information in our website and blog

Shareholders/Investors

CYJAX respects your privacy and is committed to protecting your personal data. When you invest in CYJAX, your personal data is processed by CYJAX Limited, which is the data controller responsible for determining how and why your personal data is processed

This notice explains how we obtain and manage your data.

1 Collection of personal data

In connection with your shareholding/investment, most of the information will be provided by you or someone on your behalf with your knowledge, such as a financial/investment agent. The information we will collect, use and store will usually include:

- Contact Information: Name, address, email address, phone number.
- Identity information: Copies of identity documents, shareholder information and any other information required to comply with legal or regulatory requirements.
- Communication data: Correspondence between you and our investor relations team, including emails, letters, and notes from meetings or calls.

In some circumstances we may also obtain personal data from third parties involved in the investment process, including financial advisers, investment agents, nominee shareholders, corporate registries, regulatory bodies and publicly available sources where required for legal, regulatory or administrative purposes

2 How we use your personal data

We process your personal data for the following purposes:

- Investor Relationship Management: To communicate with you about your investments, provide you with updates on our company's performance.
- Compliance with Legal and Regulatory Obligations: To meet our obligations under securities laws, tax laws, and anti-money laundering (AML) regulations.
- Processing Transactions: To process investment transactions, payments, and to fulfill any related administrative tasks.
- Communication and Notifications: To send you reports, communications, notices of meetings, and other important corporate updates.
- Recordkeeping and Reporting: To maintain accurate records of your investments and ensure compliance with legal, financial, and regulatory requirements.

3 Lawful basis and purpose of processing personal data

- Contractual Necessity: The processing is necessary for the performance of an investment agreement or to take steps prior to entering into such an agreement.
- Legal Obligations: We process your personal data to comply with applicable laws and regulatory requirements (e.g., anti-money laundering, securities regulations).
- Legitimate Interests: We process your data based on our legitimate interests in managing investor relations and ensuring our compliance with financial and regulatory obligations.
- Consent: In certain circumstances, we may seek your explicit consent to process specific types of personal data (such as for marketing communications or sharing your data with third parties for specific purposes).

4 Retention

We retain your personal data for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes for which it was collected, including compliance with legal, accounting, tax, regulatory and anti-money laundering obligations. Investor records will generally be retained for the duration of the investment relationship and for a period thereafter as required by applicable law or regulatory requirements. When personal data is no longer required, it will be securely deleted or anonymised.

5 Security

CYJAX is dedicated to ensuring that all information is protected against unauthorised access, processed appropriately, and held securely in accordance with the UK and EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and Data Protection Act 2018.

Our ISMS (information security management system) is certified to ISO/IEC 27001, demonstrating that we have the appropriate Framework in place to ensure that all our information assets and networks are secure.

All data is encrypted both in transit, end-to-end and at rest using AES-256.

6 Storage

We primarily store your personal data in the United Kingdom. However, there may be occasions when we need to transfer your personal data to countries outside of the United Kingdom, including those outside of the European Economic Area (EEA). These transfers may occur when, for example, we engage with third-party service providers or partners located outside the UK.

Where personal data is transferred outside the United Kingdom, we will ensure that an appropriate transfer mechanism is in place as required by applicable data protection law. This may include transfers to countries benefiting from adequacy regulations or the use of the UK International Data Transfer Agreement (IDTA), the UK Addendum to the European Commission's Standard Contractual Clauses, or other approved safeguards. You may contact us for further information about the safeguards applied to international transfers.

7 Sharing

We will only share your data internally and with third parties for the purposes of managing your shareholding and/or investment. The third parties may include your financial/investment agent.

CYJAX or its service providers share your personal data with third parties when:

- required by law.
- requested by a regulator.
- necessary to manage your investment, including operational, administrative, and financial processes.
- where required by applicable law, regulation or regulatory authority
- necessary for fraud and data error investigations.

The third parties include the following service providers:

All our third-party service providers are required to take appropriate security measures to protect your personal information in line with our policies. We do not allow our third-party service providers to use your personal data for their own purposes. We only permit them to process your personal data for specified purposes and in accordance with our instructions.

8 Your rights in relation to personal data

Under data protection laws in the European Union and the UK, you have certain rights in relation to your personal information. You have the right:

- to be informed about the collection and the use of your personal data.
- to access personal data and supplementary information.
- to have inaccurate personal data rectified or completed if it is incomplete.
- to erasure (to be forgotten) in certain circumstances.
- to restrict processing in certain circumstances.
- to data portability, which allows the data subject to obtain and reuse their personal data for their own purposes across different services.
- to cease/object to processing in certain circumstances.
- rights in relation to automated decision making and profiling.
- to complain to the Information Commissioner.
- Where we rely on your consent as the lawful basis for processing, withdraw that consent at any time. Withdrawal of consent will not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out before consent was withdrawn.

A full list of your rights under the UK General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) is available on the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) website.

We will handle all requests in accordance with applicable law. However, depending on the right you wish to exercise, and the nature of the personal information involved, there may be legal reasons why we cannot grant your request. If this is the case, we will write to you to explain the reasons why.

9 Accessing, rectifying, restricting, objecting or erasure of your personal information.

Requests will be acknowledged within three working days, with the final response and disclosure of information (subject to exemptions) within 30 calendar days.

A 'cease processing request' from an individual will be acknowledged immediately with an automatic email response stating that CYJAX intends to comply with the request.
